1. Discuss the following statement “Wisdom is the power to see and the inclination to choose the best and highest goal, together with the surest means of attaining it.” –J. I. Packer

2 Which of the daily Wisdom Challenge over the next 31 days will you participate in?

Level 1: For the next 31 days, I will read one chapter of the book of Proverbs every day.

Level 2: I will pick one verse from each chapter to commit to meditate on daily.

Level 3: I will not take the Daily Wisdom challenge alone. I will share my journey with others.

3. The major theme of Proverbs Chapter 2 in a nutshell is this: **Wisdom must be sought at all costs because it's too costly to live without it.**

Question: How has this proven true in your life?

My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you, turning your ear to wisdom and applying your heart to understanding—indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding. He holds success in store for the upright, he is a shield to those whose walk is blameless, for he guards the course of the just and protects the way of his faithful ones. Then you will understand what is right and just and fair—every good path. For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul. Discretion will protect you, and understanding will guard you. (Proverbs 2:1-11)

Question: What disciplines do you engage in to store up Gods word in your heart?

5. Every Proverb relies on and reveals the sovereignty of God.

For his dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom endures from generation to generation; all the inhabitants of earth are accounted as nothing, and he does

according to his will among the host of heaven and among the inhabitants of earth; and (no one) can stay his hand or say to him, "What have you done?" (Daniel 4:34-35)
